
"Alumnus **Ivan Fedorov**, Mayor of Melitopol, has been abducted by the Russian military personnel while performing humanitarian duties in the city on March 11, 2022. The Ministry of Foreign Affairs, the President of Ukraine, and the Ukrainian Parliament have called upon the international community to help free Fedorov. The United States Conference of Mayors has released a statement on the Kidnapping of a Ukrainian Mayor by Russian Forces."

"A psychologist also needs a psychologist.

Today I broke the rule, working as a volunteer psychologist at the humanitarian aid center for immigrants. Going home in a taxi this evening I cried all the way for the people of Ukraine...

People arrive from all over our region. People are bloody, they have seen their loved ones killed in front of their eyes. People are in Acute Stress Disorder. We must help them."

"I am with my wife and two children, ages 6 and 16, in the city of Chernihiv near the Russian border. We have been living in a damp and cold basement for two weeks... there is no light, gas, or water. The communications are jammed: there is no television, Wi-Fi is not working well, food is running out. I have been suffering from the flu for several days now. It is impossible to leave the city under siege. As I write, I hear machine-gun fire and shells exploding. I hope it will end as soon as possible, I hope to survive with my family. God help us!!! God, save Ukraine!!! "It's been a long, hard day. There are many more to come... Constant memories from 2014 (*Revolution of Dignity*.)

Tens of thousands of Ukrainians, both here and abroad, are rejecting Russian troops and have mobilized for a common goal - the preservation of Ukraine and its global choice.

Today, the Armed Forces of Ukraine, the national guard, the SBU, the border guards, volunteers and thousands of citizens repelled the aggressor, unfortunately, at the cost of their lives...Tough night ahead of us. But tens of thousands of Ukrainians are organized, armed, and prepared to fight!"

"Our Independent Life Center of Batumi had a Zoom teleconference with Ukrainian people with disabilities and their parents. They were talking to us from the basements where they don't even have elementary household conditions. They also don't have medications, hygiene products, food supplies, etc.

We've found that sending parcels is often pointless because it may not reach the address, so the best way to help them is to collect and transfer money to a vetted organization to distribute."







"Four years have passed since the occupation regime abducted and brutally assaulted **Archil Tatunashvili**. They waited almost a month to transfer the body back to Georgian authorities. Our country has to fight the harsh consequences of occupation on a daily basis. Russia, with the recognition of Donetsk and Luhansk, once again, have brutally violated the principles of international law.

I hope the international community will be united and in principle.
